



Volunteer Code of Conduct

This is a Dakota sacred site. Bringing intentional positive energy will support the healing of this land and the people around us. Be aware of the grief, misuse, and blatant desecration this land has been through, and still faces, and honor the healing work that is taking place here.

Wóohoda - Respect, treat this place like it is your home.

Leave this land better than you found it.

Do not destroy or mark any of the landscape features.

Respect all the plants and living beings here by leaving them where they are.

Give space to our animal relatives and their homes.

Remember this area is in active ecological restoration. Stay on the paths and trails as much as possible. If going off trail is necessary, be cautious. The plants are still working on getting established.

Leave encampments be - these are people's homes; respect their space and belongings.

Leave any prayer ties and flags where they are. These are offerings.

Safety

- DO NOT ENTER THE CAVES
- DO NOT CLIMB THE SANDSTONE BLUFFS/HILL FACES, they are extremely delicate (susceptible to erosion) and unsafe to climb.
- DO NOT PICK UP SHARPS/NEEDLES or paraphernalia that would be related to substance use.

If you come across any of these, please inform a staff member or leader immediately.

- Stay out of the water bodies.
- Stay off of trees and branches.
